


Annual Report Celebrating 10 Years

Over the past 10 years, I have had the privilege of experiencing something magical through the development and growth of Dreams for Change. We started with a small idea of using a parking lot at night as a space for families and individuals experiencing homelessness can find refuge and community. Within a month of opening the first site, every spot was filled, and I knew we were on to something great. Over the course of the 10 years, Dreams for Change developed a team of passionate employees, interns, and volunteers dedicated to bringing hope to families experiencing homelessness, to bridging employment opportunities for individuals who are unable to obtain a job, to providing meals to those who are hungry, to helping someone starts to build financial stability through savings and tax credits. Over the course of the 10 years, we were met with challenges and adversity from finding suitable locations for Safe Parking to holding systems accountable so our clients can get the resources and services they deserve. Dreams for Change remained relentless and persevered through these challenges to touch over 33,000 individuals across San Diego County.




Programs

Safe Parking

The loss of a vehicle is one of the final steps to chronic homelessness. We provide safety and case management for individuals living in their vehicles.

The Safe Parking Program provides supportive services and a safe place to park for families and individuals who are living in their vehicles.





A 12-week paid on-the-job training program coupled with work readiness and life skills training. Dreams' Cuisine program overcomes barriers and secures competitive long term employment, occupational training, and educational opportunities for those experiencing homelessness, formerly incarcerated, and youth with high barriers to employment.

The *Dreams' Cuisine* food trucks are designed to sell meal options to low-income seniors and people experiencing homelessness. Offering affordable options empowers people with the dignity of buying food that they enjoy.

Tax Assistance

We provide free tax prep to low and moderate-income households, processing thousands of tax returns and bringing millions of dollars back into communities.

In addition to tax prep, our programs offer comprehensive tax education and resolution services. We work in partnership with the IRS and help clients get in direct contact with case managers.

Social Enterprise

"The Dreams' Cuisine program is an innovative workforce development program utilizing a social enterprise model combined with weekly work readiness and life skills training. The program makes a difference in the lives of participants in 2 unique and significant ways: we offer immediate, transitional paid job training at a point when participants are facing all or most of the major barriers to employment, and we supplement that real-world training with weekly workshops focused on helping participants make significant life changes from the inside out. We understand the importance of whole-person care, so in addition to the external components of workforce development we provide opportunities for our participants to learn about other important factors, such as emotional literacy and mental health awareness, to encourage the necessary mindset shift needed for meaningful and lasting life changes." Each year, we operate San Diego County's largest free tax preparation site and mobile tax services to the disability community through the IRS's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program (VITA). The purpose of VITA is to provide free tax assistance to working families and individuals earning less than \$55,000 with a focus on ensuring those who qualify to receive the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC). In addition to tax preparation, our tax sites screen taxpayers for potential public benefits and provide Individual Taxpayer Identification application approval.

Beyond operating tax preparation sites, we play a leadership role in supporting the San Diego EITC Coalition. We support the EITC Coalition by expanding capacity through partnerships with local colleges to recruit interns for coalition members' sites, create surveys, train organizations on best practices, a market program to community and evaluate program results.

Quintin was referred to the Dreams' Cuisine program by the CARE Center, after experiencing homelessness and job instability for several years. Quintin mastered the operational procedures and was hired as a Team Lead in Oct 2019.
